This is the last newsletter for the term. I wish all the students a safe and restful break. For those who celebrate Easter, wishing you a Happy Easter.

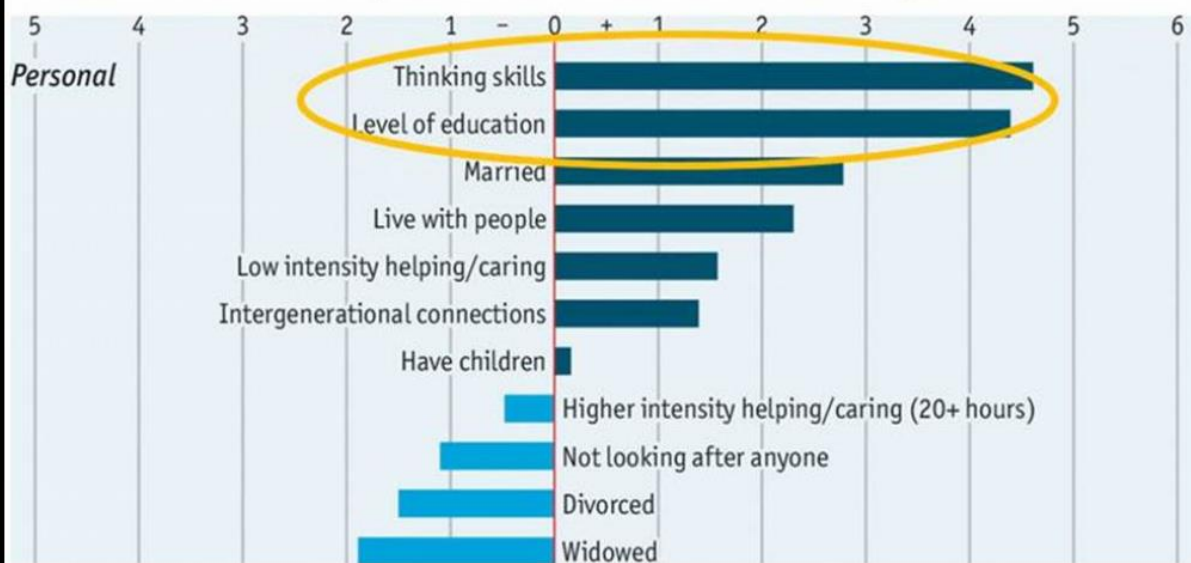

A Message about Cybersafety and Reputation Management

As Parents / Carers you play an important role in helping your children have safe and positive experiences online.

The internet, mobile phones and instant messaging provide opportunities for children to learn, be creative and socialise online. However, the online environment also provides numerous opportunities for harm to be caused to children. Our school is aware of the risks to children in the online environment and this message is to advise you of our efforts in respect to keeping your child safe online. There are a number of potential risks and concerns for students when communicating online. These include accessing and posting inappropriate content, cyberbullying, oversharing, and engaging in conversations with persons they do not know in the real world.

The school recognises students access various social media sites and apps via personal electronic devices and home networks. The school is not responsible for monitoring your child's compliance with social media apps, website age requirements and terms and conditions.

It is unacceptable for students at our school to engage in cyberbullying, or other inappropriate online behaviours. Our school's ICT Acceptable Use Agreement and Student Code of Conduct are found at the bottom of the school website front page <https://runcornss.eq.edu.au/> and provides written guidelines on acceptable online behaviour by students. If an online incident negatively impacts on the good order and management of the school, the school may impose disciplinary consequences for this behaviour. This could include suspension and/or exclusion in serious cases. In serious cases the school may also report an incident to the police.

It is recommended that you discuss with your child the importance of engaging in safe and positive online behaviours and that you highlight the importance of being a responsible digital citizen. Help your child to take steps to block anyone who makes them feel uncomfortable, harassed or bullied. If your child is connected to any social networking site, reviewing their 'friends list' and adding them as a friend yourself may help you manage their safety and reduce the risk of them associating with inappropriate contacts.

Parents / Carers should check that children are accessing sites and apps that are age appropriate. For example, Facebook, Instagram, Discord, Tik Tok and Snapchat require a user to be at least 13 years of age to create an account. As children approach this age, pressure from friends to create accounts may intensify. Encourage your child to always ask permission before using a new website or downloading a new app. If your child has created a social media account and they do not meet the age requirements, it is recommended that you work with your child to remove all posted content and deactivate the account.

Below are some of the techniques for practicing that Students have learnt over the past Term:

- ♪ Practice “often” and “slowly.” Playing at a slower tempo helps get the music ingrained in your body. It can be easy in performance situations to play too fast due to nerves.
- ♪ Focus on challenging passages and set goals.
- ♪ Relax and “Tell a story or paint a picture.” Having perfect technique is great, but what’s really important is the emotion and the story you’re telling with the music.

Year 3 are currently working on:

- ♪ Setting up their bow hold and practising exercises that strengthen their fingers.

A Therapy Dog for Runcorn?



We are currently considering the implementation of a therapy dog at Runcorn State School due to the overwhelming benefits such an initiative can have on staff and student wellbeing, as well as on learning outcomes.



As a growing body of research has demonstrated the positive effects of animal-assisted therapy, there has been an increase of the implementation of such programs in schools Australia-wide. In line with this, we have begun our own inquiries as to how this may benefit our Runcorn community. Some of our findings are listed below:-

Current Research

- 🐾 Studies have shown that the presence of companion animals can improve the well-being of children and lower anxiety levels, simply by making the environment happier and more enjoyable.
- 🐾 Dogs in the classroom can be used to calm fears, relieve anxieties and teach interpersonal and social skills.
- 🐾 School attendance, motivation to participate in activities and increases in reading and writing levels have also been explored as positive attributes to having a support dog in schools.

Experiences in School Context

- 🐾 A visit has taken place to a local primary school where a school dog is already successfully in place. This school shared with us their experience about the positive impact the dog has had across the school and we were able to see interactions with students in various classes.
- 🐾 Discussions with puppy raisers, principals and guidance officers at schools with such programs in Logan and Redcliffe have also demonstrated positive implementation over several years. The benefits for staff and students were consistently raised.
- 🐾 A full risk assessment would be part of the implementation, alongside staff and community consultation.
- 🐾 Research, information and discussions have been presented at both the School Council and P&C. Support has been given in principle at both of these forums.



Suitable Breeds, Temperaments and Training

- 🐾 Research into suitable breeds of dog have been conducted. Of most importance will be that of the dog's temperament and that of its parents, so that it is suitable for interactions with children. Supporting statements from breeders and trainers have been gained. Hypo-allergenic breeds such as Labradoodles and Cobberdogs have been considered.
- 🐾 It is understood that a therapy dog undertakes specific training to become a certified 'therapy dog' and is regularly tested for health, obedience and temperament. Suitable trainers and costings have been explored.
- 🐾 Information about immunisation, hygiene and dog health have been sought.



Ownership of the Therapy Dog

- 🐾 A responsible owner for the dog has been considered. This will ensure that the dog is well cared for when it is not working. It would live as part of a family and attend regular puppy school, manners and obedience training which will ensure appropriate socialisation and development.
- 🐾 A designated member of staff would always be present during any interaction with pupils.

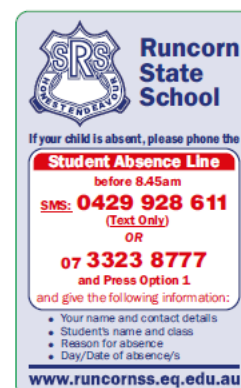

Year 4 Excursion – Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre 12/3/2021

About two weeks ago we went on an excursion to Moreton Bay. At this bay we studied the ecosystem and the reliance of many living organisms such as mangroves, crabs, fish and birds. They rely on each other to grow and reproduce. This mostly happens through consumption of other living things.

We mainly studied Mangroves and how important their roles are. They can decrease the occurrence of erosion of the shore. 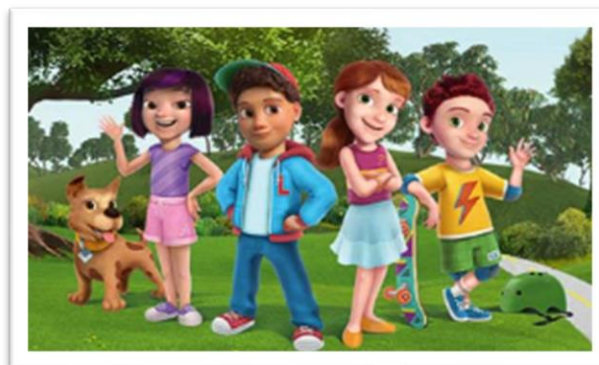
