From the Principal...

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to Term 3. I realise that many of you might have had plans that were altered due to the lockdown and

restrictions. But I trust that you are all safe. We are glad that you are back at school.

I know that the Year 1 students were amazed by the transformation of their outdoor learning area. A huge **thank you** to **Mr France** for his artistic talents, time and commitment to the school. He completed this work during the holidays.

COVID Guidelines

On Friday 9 July, you would have received a Covid plan for the first week of school.

The key points were:



- Only one adult at a time enter the school office due to the size of the space.
- Students are not required to wear a face mask when on school premises or when travelling on dedicated school transport.
- School staff are not required to wear a face mask when working with children.
- Adults, including volunteers and family members, are required to wear a face mask if they cannot maintain physical distancing from each other at school. We request as we cannot guarantee physical distancing that masks are worn when moving around the school.
- Stay home if your child or you are sick.
- <u>Get tested</u> if you have any <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>, no matter how mild.

Special parade for celebrating 120 Years

On Friday 16, we will have a short but special parade to commemorate the 120 years of Runcorn State School. The founding date was 8 July 1901. Depending on restrictions, parents can attend if they wish to. Please check current conditions on the Queensland Health website.

School Priorities

We will continue to build on our priorities for 2021. They were and still are:

Reading

Writing

A culture of thinking

Over two years, we aim to:

• Achieve between 90-100% of all students reaching minimum standards. We aim to move 45-60% of students into the Upper Two bands.

To achieve this, we must:

- Manage attendance with a goal of 95%.
- Use high yield strategies targeted to the specific learning.
- Case manage students using personal learning goals.
- Make learning fun and include outdoor learning spaces.

Inquiry learning has been introduced to Prep and Year 1. Years 3 and 6 will delve into inquiry in Semester 2. However, many other years levels are also experimenting with this way of teaching and learning. By the middle of 2022, all year levels will be teaching some units of work through an inquiry framework. We have run several parent workshops about thinking and inquiry and will continue to do so. All parents are welcome to these sessions.

Academic progress

We are tracking well against the end of year targets with 87% of students achieving C or above in English. 47.3% of students achieved the the top two bands. The end of year target was between 45-65%. 90% of students are reaching benchmarks in Mathematics. What is most pleasing is the effort students are putting into their learning. 98% of students are putting in an effort that resuled in a C or above. Well done everyone.

School Opinion Survey

The annual suite of *School Opinion Surveys* will be conducted **over the next three weeks**. All families, school staff and students in target year levels (5,6, 8 and 11) will be invited to participate. We encourage you to take this opportunity to have your say about what our school does well, and how we can improve. The Department of Education commenced sending email invitations to participants in the second week of the school holidays. Keep an eye out for yours! The students will complete their surveys at school.

Gates

From next week, the gates entering the forest area will be permanently closed. We ask families to use the main gates in front of the office. The small gate off Lampson Street will be opened for use. These matters were discussed at P&C and the purpose of closing the forest gate is to allow the space to regenerate and develop into a Natures Play space. Opening the oval gate off Lampson Street will ease the congestion on to Ardargie Street. Thank you for your cooperation.

This platform is responsive across mobile devices, tablets and desktops and will provide the school with an increased number of features to improve our electronic communication to a greater number of families.

This platform will enable the school to:

- Send email and SMS
- Build, publish and distribute eNewsletters that include links to photos, galleries and video links
- Custom eForms for Camps and Excursions with digital signatures
- Dynamic calendar and events
- Send spot polls and surveys
- Google translate 100 languages at the click of a button
- Integrate with social media, school portals, payment portals and more.

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PLEASE BE AWARE that the Schoolzine platform will replace the current newsletter distribution system and so those that do not give Third Party Consent for Schoolzine will need to access the school newsletter from the website.

- ✓ Comics or graphic novels
- ✓ If you're not sure what to read next check out a book from the 'Premier's Reading Challenge' book list (find it here <u>https://readingchallenge.education.qld.gov.au/about/booklists</u>)

If you've finished an amazing book and can't bear to move on to a new one here are some activities you could do:

- Research the author of your book they might have written other books that are similar, or if you are really lucky a sequel!
- Write a book review to share with your friends and family. Explain what makes the book so special.
- Pretend you are the author of the book. Write the next page or chapter.
- If it is a novel or chapter book you could create some illustrations to go with your favourite part.
- Create your own audio book by recording yourself reading the book (or just your favourite parts). You can use different voices for each character!

NAIDOC Week at Runcorn

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

NAIDOC originally stood for 'National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee'. The NAIDOC 2021 theme is **Heal Country!** The theme calls for all of us to continue to seek greater protections for our lands, our waters, our sacred sites and our cultural heritage from exploitation, desecration, and destruction.

Country that is more than a place and inherent to our identity. Country that we speak about like a person, sustaining our lives in every aspect - spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially, and culturally.

Runcorn State School students participated in a range of different activities from writing Reflections on this year's theme and Acknowledgement of Country to researching famous Indigenous legends past and present. They were involved in looking at different Indigenous artworks, the Language of our local Yuggera people and read a variety of different stories written and illustrated by First Nations Authors. Several classes participated in traditional Aboriginal Games!

Prep students went walking on Country and collected a variety of Native artifacts including, Grevillea leaves, Acacia seed pods, Banksia seed pods, paperbark, Moreton Bay Figs, Lemon Myrtle and River Red Gum leaves. They read stories from the Dreamtime and practiced writing Indigenous symbols in sand.

Prep S performed an Acknowledgement of Country at Junior Parade. Activities culminated in a fantastic performance by Lucas Proudfoot. Lucas Proudfoot is one of Australia's most versatile children's performers, playing guitar, didgeridoo, clap sticks, boomerang and stomp box to over 120,00 kids each year. He is a multi-platform storyteller, sharing culture and stories through his music, books and live performances. Lucas comes from the Tweed Coast area or Bundjalung country.




N&rman's News


Outside School Hours Care

The PCYC are the approved providers at our school. OSHC operate in the school premises both morning and afternoon. Our enrolment process is all online and we use QK enrol. If you are interested in enrolling your child, please email the service the following information: your full name, home address and mobile number. From there, the Coordinator puts through this information into QKenrol, a link will then be sent to your email address and you will need to fill out an enrolment form for each child and submit them. Once this is completed and the Coordinator accepts the enrolment, the booking process will begin. Once booked in, the service will then ask you to come in for an orientation before your first session. After you have been booked in, you can use the app 'MyFamily lounge' to control your bookings and to make casual bookings.

We are licenced for 75 children before and after school care. This availability also varies depending on staffing arrangements. During Vacation care we are still licenced for 75, however numbers are capped depending on the demand for the day.

We currently do not have a waiting list. Waiting lists are put through QKenrol. If you were on a waiting list, you would remain on the waiting list until a permanent spot opens for your desired session. Once one does, the service will accept the booking and you will be notified via email. The waiting list is prioritised by first in first served
